#### APPENDIX

# THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOUSES, THEIR MEMBERS AND STOCK IN THE HOMESTEAD 'LOREKALI', LOKATAP SETTLEMENT, KOTIDO DISTRICT

This is one of the old-type homesteads with a population of 96 people in April 1951. It contained the majority of the members of a large extended family. For the genealogy see Figure 9.

For each house the founding full-brothers are given first, as they do not belong to any yard. The figures in brackets give their approximate

ages.

Numbers of cattle allocated to each yard are shown opposite the wife's name. In some cases a daughter (married, or an unmarried mother) occupies a separate courtyard, but she and her children remain a part of her mother's yard as far as stock are concerned. The yards are shown in the accompanying diagram of the homestead.

House A (21 people)

Theoretically this group forms a house-line of two houses, for the father, Ila, is dead and there was no brother. The junior house is represented by an unmarried mother and her younger sister, and it tends to be submerged by the senior house headed by a young married man.


Stock camps

- 3. House F.


